



Christmas bookings How to prepare your holiday ho-ho-home

Any holiday is a special occasion, but when it comes to Christmas breaks your guests will be filled with even more anticipation than usual. The countdown is on and chances are they've been looking forward to this for months – and even if they leave it late to book, think how long they may have been saving or planning for their Christmas getaway. Christmas tree

What says "Christmas" more than the iconic tree? Space permitting, this is the perfect way to add the festive feel to your property. A real Christmas tree is a lovely touch and may be more than guests are used to at home. A tree with non-drop needles is ideal to minimise the amount of clean-up required (keep an eye out for Nordman and Fraser firs) but a good-quality artificial tree is a great alternative – not to mention you'll be able to use it year after year. Add some decorations in keeping with your property's aesthetic and you've got the perfect festive focal point for your holiday home.

Welcome pack

If you already provide a welcome pack, you'll know how much your visitors love them. It gets the holiday off to the perfect start and makes a great first impression on quests. At Christmas time, why not add a seasonal touch with a packet of mince pies? Family favourites such as Nestlé Matchmakers (very popular here at Sykes HQ!) have also been on sale at Lidl for only 99p, so you can add a Christmas welcome for next to nothing. Non-perishables such as Christmas crackers are also a great touch and can be tucked away for next year if they go unused. If children are coming, wrapping a small stockingfiller gift will delight your guests - and again, you don't need to spend big to make a big impression. With 12% of positive reviews mentioning a welcome pack and 15% of negative reviews mentioning the lack of a welcome pack, it's clear that these make a big impression!

Engage the senses

You may already be using air fresheners or scented candles in your property. Help it feel just like Christmas by using some seasonal scents. Think apple & cinnamon, pumpkin spices, and classic pine.

The little touches
