




Welcome





Delightful Devon pub walks, via the South West Coast Path

Beautiful trails with fantastic pubs to discover on route









Devon pub walks combine two of the best things about staying in our region – picturesque hiking trails and traditional village inns, all of which serve great food in a warm and welcoming setting. This autumn, why not head to the coast path and spend leisurely days walking from village to village, admiring the scenery as the leaves change from green to gold. With so many fantastic foodie pitstops along the way, not to mention breathtaking views, you won't be disappointed. Whether you're looking for a short stroll and a quick waterside pint or a day-long hike punctuated by a hearty Sunday roast, you'll find all this and more in our Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.



The Village Inn, Thurlestone

Situated in the heart of the picturesque coastal village of Thurlestone, The Village Inn is a delightful traditional pub, serving fabulous food. Whether you opt for beer battered south coast cod and chips or moules marinière, you are sure to leave feeling refueled and ready to tackle the coast path. Walkers can head in one direction towards the surfer's paradise of Bantham, with views over Bigbury Bay, or in the other direction towards Thurlestone Sands, Hope Cove, and beyond that, Salcombe!

The Ferry Boat Inn, Dittisham

The Ferry Boat Inn (or FBI) is a cosy one-bar pub on the waterfront in beautiful Dittisham, where you can enjoy stunning views of a peaceful stretch of the River Dart and choose from a menu strongly based on fresh, locally sourced ingredients. With hearty options like game casserole and homemade pies, this is a fabulous stop for an autumn warmer. Why not enjoy a long walk along the Dart Valley Trail – begin at Dartmouth, catch the ferry to Kingswear and follow the path all the way to Greenway, before crossing the water back to Dittisham. Stop at the Ferry Boat Inn before continuing through the wooded Raleigh Estate, heading back to historic Dartmouth. It's a 10-12 mile challenge even for experienced hikers, but well worth it for the views alone. You can shorten the walk by catching the ferry from Dittisham back to Dartmouth, for those with tired legs!

The Cricket Inn, Beesands

One of the most popular food-oriented pubs in South Devon, the Cricket Inn is situated right on the seafront in the fishing village of Beesands. It's especially popular for Sunday lunches and seafood dinners, and it also boasts an impressive claim to

fame: The Cricket Inn is where Mick Jagger and Keith Richards performed together in public for the first time.

With fish pie on the menu, as well as delicious burgers and steaks, there are plenty of options for lunch or supper. Why not walk from Torcross along the South West Coast Path to Beesands, or try the circular walk that takes in both Beesands and Hallsands?

The Hope & Anchor, Hope Cove

Hope Cove is a picturesque and atmospheric former haunt for smugglers, with two beautiful beaches. The Hope & Anchor is a spacious pub with a wide-ranging menu combining pub classics with original dishes. There's a large outside terrace, ideal for making the most of sunny autumnal days and the beach views. A stone's throw away, you'll also find the Cove, a lively café-bar.

Hope Cove is perfectly placed for a range of walks, which include a long circular hike from Salcombe (going one way along the South West Coast Path and back inland through Malborough). Another, easier option is to take a smaller circular route from Hope Cove, Bolt Tail and Bolberry. The views from this stunning stretch of the South Devon coastline will take your breath away, not to mention help you work up an appetite.

Must-visit destinations for a delicious hot chocolate

South Devon is home to vast array of fantastic cafés, tea rooms and restaurants serving warming beverages and delectable treats – including the ultimate autumn warmer... hot chocolate!

Whether you have just stepped off a boat after a bracing cruise around the South Devon coastline, or are walking the South West Coast Path and need a pitstop, here are our top five places to enjoy a steaming mug of cocoa in this beautiful region.



Stokeley Farm Shop

Situated in a fabulous spot near Slapton Ley and the stunning Start Bay coastline, visitors to Stokeley Farm Shop can expect delicious locally sourced food and drinks. From soups and hearty meals like spaghetti bolognaise, to mouth-watering cakes and, of course, hot chocolate, you won't be disappointed!

Why not head out for a walk around Slapton Ley National Nature Reserve before returning for a 'Special Hot Chocolate' at the farm shop café, topped with cream and marshmallows – delicious.

Saveurs, Dartmouth

Saveurs is a boulangerie, chocolaterie, and patisserie in the heart of Dartmouth. Traditionally French, this bakery and restaurant produces excellent freshly made bread, chocolate, pastries and cakes. Enjoy an autumn shopping spree, visiting the art galleries and independent boutiques lining the town's cobbled streets, before sampling one of Saveurs' special homemade hot chocolates, made using Valrhona chocolate, caramel and vanilla pods!

South Devon Chilli Farm

Fancy something a little different? The South Devon Chilli Farm, near Loddiswell, offers fabulous food, not to mention hot chocolates with a twist. Made using their chilli chocolate, try their slightly 'warmer' alternative – hot chocolate with a chilli kick. For those who prefer to keep things traditional, why not opt for a normal hot chocolate, or 'go luxury' and add cream, marshmallows and Belgian chocolate drops!

After you have devoured your tasty treats, visit the show tunnel and view the wonderful array of chillies growing.

Island Street Bar and Grill

Located on the edge of the stunning Salcombe estuary, the Island Street Bar and Grill is a fabulous eatery to retreat to, after a leisurely stroll along Salcombe's quayside or a fun hour crabbing with the children. Try their deluxe hot chocolate option - with whipped cream & marshmallows, this is a cup of joy, sure to warm your cockles.

The Hope and Anchor

This traditional pub is just metres from the beach, in quaint Hope Cove. With miles of South West Coast Path 'on the doorstep', this is the perfect place for a pitstop. Walk from Bantham to Hope Cove, stopping at The Hope and Anchor for lunch and a deluxe hot chocolate (a classic hot chocolate with mini marshmallows and flaked chocolate) beside the fire.

Autumn recipe: spiced blackberry hot chocolate

Juicy blackberry and rich chocolate is an all-time favoured flavour combination, for its tangy, mouth-watering blend of aromas. On cooler autumnal days, make the most of the kitchen in your holiday home, making delicious freshly-picked blackberry hot chocolates – the perfect cosy drink to enjoy snuggled up on the sofa.



SERVES 4 YOU WILL NEED

For the hot chocolate...

200g fresh blackberries
3 tbsp icing sugar
1 tbsp water
½ tsbp vanilla extract
720ml full-fat milk
120g 70% chocolate
1 tbsp water
¼ tsp cinnamon powder

For the topping...

Whipped cream
Marshmallows
Cinnamon stick
Freshly-picked blackberries

TO MAKE

- 1. Take your freshly picked blackberries, tablespoon of water and icing sugar, and heat on a medium-high heat for 5 minutes until the berries soften.
- 2. Get rid of seeds, for a smooth texture, by pushing the cooked ingredients and juices through a sieve.
- 3. Boil the milk.
- 4. Whilst your milk is heating, chop your chocolate into chunks and blend with vanilla extract.
- 5. Pour hot milk over chocolate and allow to melt into the chocolate for a few moments.
- 6. Keep 1 tbsp of your cooked and sieved blackberry juices to one side. Pour the rest of the blackberry juices into the blended chocolate and vanilla extract, add cinnamon and blend together until frothy.
- 7. Taste and add if necessary, add desired sweetening.
- 8. Pour hot chocolate into mug and add your left-over blackberry juice, sweet and spicy toppings.... Cosy up on the sofa and enjoy!

Autumn recipe: Devonshire sloe gin

Around South Devon, you will find wild blackthorn trees full of sloes, and some of the best spots that we've found this year are at Bolberry, Soar Mill Cove and Hope Cove. You will need to pick enough to half-fill the bottle you're using, or pick as many as you can find, and if you have more then why not make another bottle or two! Our tip to making the perfect sloe gin is to wait until the first signs of frost show, or to freeze your berries, as these ripen the sloes best. We highly recommend whilst you pick your sloes, to also pick blackberries to freeze at home, so that you can put a few of these as an extra treat in your glass when you finally get to enjoy your tipple!



MAKES 900ml

YOU WILL NEED


500g ripe sloes 250g granulated caster sugar 1 litre of gin (we recommend Salcombe Gin) 2 litre sealed container/bottle

TO MAKE

- 1. Take your frozen sloes out of the freezer, or gather your frosted sloes together, and prick them so that the skin peels.
- 2. Put your sloes in the bottle that you have chosen. Create a paper funnel and pour in the granulated sugar, before pouring the gin on top. Add the gin and seal the bottle tight.
- 3. Give your bottled gin a good shake for a minute.
- 4. Place your bottle in a window for a minimum of two months, where sunlight will be in direct contact.

Autumn recipe: blackberry and apple crumble

One of our favourite British puddings, that sweetly reminds us that autumn is here, is delicious fruity crumble packed with tantalising flavours. As the hedgerows bring an abundance of free-for-all blackberries, and apples that taste their best throughout the autumn months, bake a delicious warming crumble with these wonderful ingredients.



SERVES 4

YOU WILL NEED

For the crumble...

120g plain flour 60g caster sugar 60g unsalted butter at room temperature 1/4 tsp ground cinnamon 85g shelled pistachios (optional)

For the fruit compote...

300g cooking apples 30g unsalted butter 30g demerara sugar 115g blackberries ¼ ground cinnamon Devonshire clotted cream or vanilla ice cream to serve (optional)

TO MAKE

- 1. To begin, preheat the oven to 200 °C (gas mark 6).
- 2. For the crumble, simply rub butter, sifted flour, a dash of cinnamon and sugar together, using your fingertips, until it resembles a light breadcrumb texture. Alternatively, use a food processor to create your breadcrumbs, but be careful to not overwork it as the crumble can become too heavy. If you are wishing to add pistachios for an extra crunchy, nutty topping, then stir them lightly into your crumble now. Sprinkle your cinnamon crumble topping evenly onto a baking sheet. Place in the oven till lightly coloured (approximately 15 minutes).
- 3. Slice, core and peel the apples into thick slices.
- 4. Place the butter and demerara sugar in a saucepan on a medium heat until the mixture caramelises (approximately 3-5 minutes). Then, add the thickly sliced apples into the saucepan for three minutes, before adding blackberries and cinnamon for a further 3-5 minutes. Take the saucepan off the heat, and let it rest for a few minutes. Place your warm fruit into an ovenproof dish and pour the crumble evenly on top. Heat in the oven for 8-10 minutes, until the crumble is golden and crisp. Leave your delicious crumble to rest for 10 minutes, before serving with lashings of Devonshire clotted cream or vanilla ice cream.

Dartmouth Hotel, Golf & Spa

The Dartmouth Hotel Golf Club and Spa is an easy five-mile drive from Dartmouth. The spa includes an indoor swimming pool, sauna, steam room and Jacuzzi as well as a well-equipped gym with a resident sports therapist. The spa treatments range from simple manicure files and polishes to a Rasul Mud experience (a traditional Egyptian bathing ritual open to individuals and couples).

Book individual treatments or an indulgent spa day package, such as the Dartmouth Wellbeing Couples' experience or the Lazy Sunday Spa Afternoon. Finish the day with a meal or drink at the bar and bistro.







Salcombe HarSPA

The spa at Salcombe Harbour Hotel, located on Salcombe's beautiful waterfront, has everything you'd expect from a luxurious spa facility and more, including an indoor swimming pool, hydrotherapy pool, sauna, steam room and fitness suite.

The range of therapies and treatments is extensive, including ritual top-to-toe treatments, Lomi Lomi (traditional Hawaiian) and hot stone massages, advanced facials and much more. You can choose from day-long, half-day and shorter sessions including a twilight spa evening – the perfect way to round off your day.

Salcombe Harbour Hotel is also home to the Jetty Restaurant, an award-winning eatery with an emphasis on fresh local produce.

Thurlestone Voyage

Located near the beautiful stretch of coastline at Thurlestone Sands, the Voyage Spa uses high-quality Decléor and Ytsara treatments and products to provide visitors with a lavish pampering experience.

The spa includes an indoor pool, jet spa hydrotherapy pool, a dry heat Laconium, fitness studio, steam room and separate sauna. Book a full day, which could be the Voyage Spa Day, a package that grants access to all the spa facilities, or something more luxurious such as the Voyage Spa Ocean Experience, which includes a Voyage Spa Ocean Escape treatment (1hr 25mins) and a two-course lunch. Individual treatments are also available.

The Haven Spa

The Haven Spa, located in the pretty and conveniently-located market town of Kingsbridge, is a boutique establishment with five treatment rooms and a relaxation lounge. There's a team of beauty and complementary therapists who offer an extensive selection of options.

Book an individual treatment, from a classic pedicure to a traditional Swedish massage, or indulge in a full spa package. This could be, for example, a Heavenly Haven package, which includes a salt scrub, Swedish full body massage and pro-radiance Facial, or perhaps a Mini Me Time, which includes an Elemis Taster Facial, deep tissue back massage, and a file and polish for your fingers and toes.

On water...

Spending time on the water is always great fun, regardless of the time of year. With a decent wetsuit, a warm bobble hat and a buoyancy aid (if appropriate), you will be well insulated and ready to face the elements! Kayaking

South Devon is fantastic for kayaking, especially for families with younger children eager to explore the coastline by water. Not only do the grown ups get a good physical workout, but little ones love sitting back with eagle eyes, looking for fish, seals and even the elusive mermaid! There are many places you can hire kayaks from, or even participate in a kayak tour with, including Sea Kayak Salcombe (South Sands), Surfing Sam (South Milton Sands), Sea Kayak Devon (Dartmouth) and Discovery Surf School (Bigbury-on-Sea).

Stand up paddleboarding

South Devon enjoys a thriving 'SUP' scene, and is home to many beautiful beaches, coves and estuaries, providing the perfect playground for paddle boarders. If the weather conditions are favourable (not too windy!), most people pick up paddle boarding fairly quickly. There are various places you can hire boards from, including Waterborn (Kingsbridge), Sea Kayak Salcombe

(South Sands), Surfing Sam (South Milton Sands), and Discovery Surf School (Bigbury-on-Sea).

Surfing

If you really want to get in amongst the waves, then book a surf lesson with Discovery Surf. Based in the stunning location of Bigbury-on-Sea and Challaborough Bay, they offer tuition for all ages and abilities.

Disocovery Surf School is run by husband and wife duo, Annika and Martin Connely, who says that "South Devon has some of the best beaches for surfing and paddleboarding and there are many ways to make the most of the your time on the water. We recommend checking the conditions before you head out, a calm day could be perfect for paddle boarding or if it's rough or windy, surfing might be a better option. If you're not sure you can always get some advice from us here at Discovery. Always head out with a friend or let someone know where you are so you stay safe, and again if in doubt ask for some advice. There is so much equipment out there and if you're learning to surf make sure you're on a big, stable foam board, which makes it much easier for getting to your feet and catching waves."

Walking

South Devon is a walker's paradise and boasts a myriad of walking routes that criss cross the region. Home to an abundance of wildlife, historical landmarks and secret coves, it's the perfect spot to enjoy numerous beautiful autumn walks. South West Outdoor Festival 5th - 7th October

A weekend bursting with outdoor adventure and entertainment, The National Trust is hosting this years 'South West Outdoor Festival' at East Soar Outdoor Experience, located just outside Salcombe. The two day festival includes exhilarating activities such as trail running, mountain biking, swimming, slacklining, and coasteering alongside a variety of talks, workshops and yoga classes.

Dartmouth Food Festival 19th - 21st October

During the first weekend of the October half term holiday, the historic town of Dartmouth will host the 16th annual Dartmouth Food Festival. Experience South Devon's National Trust gems this autumn





The South Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty is home to three National Trust properties, all of which offer a fascinating day out, complete with historical interest, stunning views and fresh country air. They are all well worth a visit this autumn, particularly as all three have beautiful gardens, with radiant summer blossoms that subtly change to glowing red and gold foliage with the shifting seasons.

Here's a little information about where to find these National Trust gems, what to expect and what we love about them.

Coleton Fishacre, near Kingswear

Step back in time to the 1920s and explore the Art Deco former home of Rupert and Dorothy D'Oyly Carte. Built in 1926, this country retreat is a wonderful place to visit thanks to its stunning valley views and splendid interiors. The fun interactive elements mean you can try on clothing and hats from the 1920s and listen to jazz music from the era, immersing yourself in the glamorous lifestyles of the original residents.

There are beautiful gardens to explore, with seasonal walks organised by the National Trust staff to help you appreciate the colourful flora. There's also inside and outside seating at the Coleton Café – perfect for enjoying light refreshments.

Open daily until 28th October, after which open only at weekends.

Greenway House and Gardens, near Kingswear

Visit the former home of Devon's most famous daughter, Dame Agatha Christie, for a wonderfully evocative day on the banks of the River Dart. Learn more about the 'Queen of Crime' from the lovingly maintained 1940s interior, not just about Dame Agatha's writing but also her other passions, such as her archaeological expeditions to the Middle East.

Greenway gardens are well worth exploring in their own right, not least because the views from the estate are some of the most breathtaking in the region. Opportunities to take fantastic photos abound, whether you're looking across to Dittisham from Greenway Quay or gazing out over the Dart Valley towards Dartmouth from the top of the hill.

Why not visit on 10th, 17th or 24th October, and listen to a special talk from one of the volunteers about the history of Greenway pre-Agatha Christie. Or pop along on 18th October and join the countryside rangers for a guided walk through the garden to see the autumn woodland colours. Throughout October half term there is also a Harvest Trail at Greenway, especially for children.

Open daily until 28th October, after which open only at weekends.

Overbeck's House and Garden, Salcombe

In a commanding position above South Sands, Overbeck's House is a treasure trove of interesting art and quirky artefacts, with a

colourful garden renowned for its rare plant species from the tropics and around the world. Built in 1913, this unique property is the former home of scientist and inventor, Otto Overbeck, and was bequeathed to the National Trust following his death in 1937.

Explore the art and natural history collections, walk the garden trails, enjoy the magnificent views and then stop for a break in the tea room, and savour a delicious Devonshire cream tea.

Bring the children to visit for their Halloween Spooky Fun. Taking place on 26th and 27th October, children can enjoy craft activities, storytelling and a ghostly garden trail! Open daily until 28th October.


North Sands


Approximately a mile from Salcombe, North Sands is dog-friendly 365 days a year, situated adjacent to The Winking Prawn beach café, which welcomes well-behaved dogs. Why not sit and indulge in a delicious meal, with your pooch

by your side, after an afternoon of fetch?

Soar Mill Cove

The secluded sandy beach at Soar Mill Cove looks like something out of an Enid Blyton book, tucked away in the valley just outside of Salcombe, only accessible by foot via The South West Coast Path. This picturesque cove is definitely worth the walk in the autumn months, as there are lots of blackberry bushes on route, loaded with antioxidants, fibre and vitamins, which are great for both you and your canine as a little treat, so why not take a small container with you to fill it up with juicy goodness!







Thurlestone and South Milton Sands

Thurlestone and South Milton Sands join together to make a long, sandy stretch of beach that's dog-friendly all year round. Dogs love this beach, as the wide-open sand is just the ticket for a run around. There are usually a vast array of canines visiting Thurlestone and South Milton Sands, so your four-legged friend can enjoy meeting other waggly tails! We highly recommend walking into Thurlestone village for a scrummy roast dinner to warm you up after a blustery, refreshing autumn beach walk.

Slapton Sands

Slapton Sands is a three-mile shingle stretch of beach, incorporating both Strete Gate and Torcross Beach. It's a completely level walk with plenty of parking and some great dog-friendly eateries. Dog-friendly year-round, Slapton Sands is the perfect beach for a leisurely stroll.

Beesands and Hallsands

Just south of Torcross are the traditional fishing villages of Beesands and Hallsands. Head to Beesands to feast in the dog-friendly, award winning pub, The Cricket Inn, before starting the circular walking route from Beesands beach to Hallsands, where four-legged friends can't help but run straight in the sea!

Sugary Cove

Sugary cove is located on the South Devon Heritage Coast, at the mouth of the River Dart, near Dartmouth Castle. This peaceful, remote shingle beach is dog-friendly all year round, and is tucked away in wooded cliffs, accessible by a steep, winding downhill path. The beauty of this hidden cove is not just it's stunning views of the River Dart, but the rarity of a spot so tranquil – perfect for an early morning stroll with your pooch to stretch out your legs!

Here are a few of our favourite ways to get creative this autumn, whatever the weather.

Leaf Wreath

What you'll need:
Paper plate
Leaves
Scissors
Glue

This fantastic affordable craft is perfect for the lead up to autumn time! Pick a fallen leaves and take them back to your holiday property. Cut out the circular centre of the paper plate so that you are left with a thick edge. Glue the leaves that you have hand-picked around the edge of the paper plate – the more leaves, the fuller the wreath! Place on the door, or in the entrance to the property, to create a homely autumnal atmosphere!





Leaf rubbing

What you'll need:

Leaves

Paper

Crayons

Quick, easy, colourful and a superb addition to any holiday home! Get a warm coat on and go for a lovely autumn walk around the stunning South Devon countryside, and pick some of the best fallen leaves that you can find. When you get back to your property, get your crayons and paper out and prepare to get creative. Place a leaf under a piece of paper (if your leaves are damp then dry them off first) and colour in your piece of paper that is overlaying the leaf. As you rub colour on the paper, you should see the outlines of the leaf appearing – watch your beautiful art piece come to life!

Autumn leaf garland

What you'll need:

Leaves

Scissors

PVA glue

Ribbon

Paint, pens, glitter (optional)

An autumn leaf garland will add that extra bit of magic to your holiday home. To make this delightful craft, pick a handful or two of fallen leaves. Decorate the leaves that you have picked, however you see fit – we love to decorate our leaf garlands with golden glitter! To do this, apply glue to your leaf and dust it with a sprinkling of glitter. Let the glue dry and once dry, shake off any excess glitter. Ask a guardian to poke a hole in the leaves that you have decorated, near the stem, and thread ribbon through each and tie a hole at each end. Hang your leaf garland up and watch the golden leaves shimmer in the reflection of the beaming sun rays, glimpsing through the window of your

cosy cottage.

Apple Printing

What you'll need:

Apples

Paper

Knife

Paint

From crumble to entertaining crafts, this tasty fruit is one to take advantage of through the autumn months. Get an adult to cut an apple in half, or to cut out your desired shape... as long as you're not too tempted to eat it! Paint the flat surface of the apple and press it onto paper and voila... keep painting until your heart's content!

Conker caterpillars

What you'll need:

Conkers

Pipe cleaners

Googly eyes, or paper and pens

Metal skewer

Strong glue

"Conkers, I'm collecting conkers"...when walking around South Devon this autumn, you'll be sure to spot some conkers. Make a fun little competition between yourselves to see how many conkers you can gather, to make some fantastic friendly conker caterpillar crafts on rainy days! To make your conker caterpillar, start by picking approximately 10 conkers, with 1 preferably bigger conker for the head. Get an adult to pierce through the conkers to make a hole in each one with a metal skewer. Thread through the conkers with a pipe cleaner, and make a fold at the end of the pipe cleaner so that they don't fall off, once threaded through. You can glue this to secure it further. Glue on googly eyes, or make your own paper eyes to bring your caterpillar to life!
